Attendance at a German school can only be successful for pupils who are well-prepared – both culturally and linguistically. This is the aim of the preparatory program at the Carl Duisberg Training Center in Radolfzell, providing a German Intensive Course Plus, Language for Mathematics and Science and English classes.

German Intensive Course Plus

This clearly structured Carl Duisberg German Language Training Program is based on European standard foreign language teaching. Our competent trainers give regular feedback on your child's learning progress. In addition to the regular classes, two afternoons a week there is a guided self-learning program for pupils to deepen and practice what they have learnt on an individual basis. The length of the course depends on the child's previous knowledge of German and individual language ability. School entry requirement for those pupils wishing to sit the German Abitur is CEF level B2. Pupils below the age of 15 have one-to-one tuition with teaching methods appropriate for their age group.

The Language of Maths and Science, English Classes

In small groups of at least three the students learn the necessary terminology and language structures for Mathematics and Science from CEF Level B1 and reach the standard required in English for the appropriate grade in the German high school.

Leisure Program

The varied leisure program provides our students with ample opportunities to practice their German in informal situations. The infrastructure and amenities in Radolfzell are ideal for students to feel at home and become immersed in German life and culture.
